Dan Welch is an educator with a public school district in northeast Ohio. Welch has also co-edited several volumes in the Emerging Civil War's Tenth Anniversary Series, including: *Grant Vs. Lee, The Summer of '63: Vicksburg & Tullahoma*, and *The Summer of '63: Gettysburg*. Dan is also the co-author of *Ohio at Antietam: The Buckeye State's Sacrifice on America's Bloodiest Day* with the History Press. He currently serves as the editor of the long-running *Gettysburg Magazine* and the Emerging Revolutionary War book series. He has published numerous essays, articles, and book reviews, as well.
