Dr. Bonnie Brice Dorwart received the A.B. degree, cum laude with honors in Biology from Bryn Mawr College and the M.D. degree from Temple University School of Medicine, AOA. Her Internship and Residency in Internal Medicine were served at Lankenau Medical Center (LMC) in Wynnewood, PA, and her Fellowship in Rheumatology at the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine. She cared for patients with rheumatic diseases for 32 years at LMC, having been Chair of the Section on Rheumatology for 15 years. As Clinical Professor of Medicine, Adjunct Faculty, she taught at Jefferson Medical College for 15 years.

Dr. Dorwart is author or co-author of 50 peer-reviewed articles or book chapters on rheumatology, and feature editor for medical history of Journal of Clinical Rheumatology since 2003.

Since retiring in 2001, she researched and published *Carson's Materia Medica of 1851: An Annotation* (2003 and 2005) and *Death is in the Breeze: Disease during the American Civil War* (2009). She continues to serve as volunteer Archivist for the LMC, and Historian for the Walter and Leonore Annenberg Conference Center for Medical Education at LMC.

Dr. Dorwart is a member of the National Museum of Civil War Medicine as well as the Society of Civil War Surgeons. She is a Fellow of the College of Physicians of Philadelphia, Fellow of the American College of Physicians, and Fellow of the American College of Rheumatology.
