

ESSENTIAL CIVIL WAR CURRICULUM

Dr. Richard H. Owens is Professor of history at West Liberty University, where he also served as president from 2001-06. He earned his B.A. at Manhattan College, M.A. at Old Dominion University, and doctorate in United States history at the University of Maryland. He is the author of several books, including: *Vigilance and Virtue: Biography of General and Ambassador Horace Porter* (Porter was a Civil War General and U.S. Ambassador to France), *The Neutrality Imperative* (on American foreign policy), *Rogue State: The Unconstitutional Process of Establishing West Virginia Statehood*, *Peaceful Warrior: A Biography of Horace Porter (1837-1921)* (a monograph on Horace Porter's diplomatic career); and three historical novels: *Potomac: A Story of America in 1940*, *Knightime* (set in the Civil War and WWII), and *Conspiracy of Terror*; plus several articles, including: "An Astonishing Career: Horace Porter and the U.S. Civil War," "His More Distant Hero: Horace Porter and Abraham Lincoln," and "Autumn Before the Fall: Affirmation of Union Victory, November-December, 1864," and other historical articles. In 1993, Owens served as historian and commentator for "A Nation Divided," a BBC radio production on the U.S. Civil War.
