

ESSENTIAL CIVIL WAR CURRICULUM

Professor Julie L. Holcomb received her PhD in Transatlantic History from the University of Texas at Arlington in 2010. Her dissertation ““There is Death in the Pot: Women, Consumption, and Free Produce in the Transatlantic World, 1791-1848” examined the international boycott of slave labor. Holcomb also holds an MLIS in Archives and Records Management from the University of Texas at Austin and is a Certified Archivist. From 2001 through 2008, she served as Archivist and later as Director of the Pearce Civil War and Western Art Collections at Navarro College, Corsicana, Texas. In 2008, Holcomb was appointed to the faculty of the department of museum studies at Baylor University, Waco, Texas. Her publications include numerous articles on the abolitionist movement. Her book *Southern Sons, Northern Soldiers: The Civil War Letters of the Remley Brothers, 22nd Iowa* was published by Northern Illinois University Press in 2004. She is working on her second book *Moral Commerce: The Transatlantic Boycott of Slavery*, which is under contract to Cornell University Press.
