Mary DeCredico joined the History Department at the U.S. Naval Academy in 1986, after receiving her Ph.D. from Vanderbilt University. Her specialty is the Civil War era and the Confederacy. Mary's first book, *Patriotism for Profit: Georgia's Urban Entrepreneurs and the Confederate War Effort* (Chapel Hill: University of North Carolina Press, 1990) received the Museum of the Confederacy's Jefferson Davis Award for outstanding scholarship on the Confederacy. She has also written *Mary Boykin Chesnut: A Confederate Woman's Life* (Lanham, MD: Rowman & Littlefield, 1996), which is in its second printing, as well as several articles and book chapters. Her current project, *Confederate Citadel: Richmond and Its People Go to War, 1861 – 1865*, is under contract with the University Press of Kentucky. Mary also serves on the Board of Directors of the National Civil War Museum and is co-chair of the Museum's Education Committee that plans exhibits.
