

ESSENTIAL CIVIL WAR CURRICULUM

Dr. Michael Landis (Boston University and George Washington University) is a scholar of United States history with a focus on the intersection of politics and slavery in the nineteenth century. He is presently an Assistant Professor of History at Tarleton State University in Stephenville, Texas. His current book, entitled *Northern Men with Southern Loyalties: The Democratic Party and the Sectional Crisis* (Ithaca, NY: Cornell University Press, 2014), is a comprehensive exploration of Northern Democrats and Northern pro-slavery sentiment in the 1850s. He received his B.A. and M.A. in history from Boston University, and his Ph.D. from The George Washington University. He has published several essays and book reviews, and authored an article on United States Senator William Pitt Fessenden (R-ME) and the early Republican Party, which was published in the journal *American Nineteenth Century History* in 2008.
