

ESSENTIAL CIVIL WAR CURRICULUM

David S. Reynolds is a Distinguished Professor at the CUNY Graduate Center. A native of Rhode Island, he earned his B.A. from Amherst College (1970) and his Ph.D. from the University of California at Berkeley (1979). His books include *Beneath the American Renaissance: The Subversive Imagination in the Age of Emerson and Melville* (winner of the Christian Gauss Award), *Walt Whitman's America* (winner of the Bancroft Prize and the Ambassador Book Award), *John Brown, Abolitionist* (winner of the Gustavus Myers Outstanding Book Award), *Mightier than the Sword: "Uncle Tom's Cabin" and the Battle for America* (recognized by *The New Yorker* and *Kirkus* among the best nonfiction books of the year), *Waking Giant: America in the Age of Jackson* (among *Washington Post* Best Books of the Year), *Walt Whitman, George Lippard, and Faith in Fiction: The Emergence of Religious Literature in America*. Three of Reynolds's books have been listed among the Notable Books of the Year by the *New York Times Book Review*, for which he regularly writes. Reynolds, who is listed in *Who's Who in America*, is also the editor or coeditor of seven books, including the forthcoming *Lincoln's Selected Writings: A Norton Critical Edition*.
